The award consists of a badge and recognition of the Pack through upcoming issues of the Chinook Council E-news.

Start Planning Early

It is never too early to start thinking about adventure activities. Adequate planning is essential and requires special care. All groups participating need to refer to the "Camping and Outdoor Activity Guide"

For further information about the Adventure Award, please contact the local Scout Office and leave a message for the ACC Program.

To qualify a Cub Pack must take part in the following activities.

Requirements:

5 – Full day outdoor events including at least one overnight stay

For example – 3 full day outdoor activities plus 1 – 2 day outdoor activity involving an overnight stay or campout

Award: Badge
Pack recognition

How to earn the award:

Registered Cub Packs in the Chinook Council may qualify for the Chinook Council Adventure Award if their activities conform to the following ground rules:

1. The plans for the outdoor activities must be submitted to the Council before any of the specific activities begin and no later than the last day of February. The planning must involve the Group Commissioner and all leaders (Kim is part of the leadership team) and parents, with documented input from the youth, specifically the Sixer's Council
2. Two of the activities must be planned by the Cubs through the Sixer's Council with minimal assistance from the leaders
3. The Activities:
 - a. Should be held outdoors
 - b. Should be a true adventure (from a Cub's perspective) that challenge the capabilities of the group and are age appropriate
 - c. May be held on land, water or air
 - d. Must involve participation by all members of the group (youth and leaders) in the planning, organization and execution of the activity
4. Following the completion of the approved list of outdoor activities, a complete report must be forwarded to the Council
5. The report (log) should contain:
 - a. A general report of the activities submitted by the leaders.
 - b. The report should be in a format which would assist another Pack to use it as a guide to operating the same activity for their Pack.
 - c. Details of the planning and preparation that went into the activity such as research, safety planning, equipment and permits (permissions) required, together with a copy of the budget compared to actual costs
 - d. An outline of the activity including menus identifying which meals were prepared by the Cubs (suggestion is 50%)
 - e. The list of activities requested by the Cubs through their Sixer's Council and how the particular activities were chosen (vote by show of hands or secret ballot, or consensus)
 - f. Photographs, maps, and sketches to illustrate the narrative in order to make the activity appealing to other Cub Packs, specifically the Sixer's Council
 - g. The report should include contributions by the Cubs by way of drawings, pictures, stories and comments. Any written portions should be in their own handwriting
6. Suggestions:
 - a. The Council **will not** make any suggestions
 - b. **Ask the Cubs what type of challenge they want to do**
